



Ibaraki Prefecture is known for its incredible sightseeing areas. The Suigo Itako Iris Garden, famous for their flowers, and Fukuroda Falls, one of the three great falls in Japan. There are many scenic and historical areas, and you can also enjoy the beautiful view from the sea. Start your special trip from Ibaraki Port!



**2 Kamiiso-no-Torii Gate (Oarai Issosaki-jinja Shrine)** 3km/10 minutes

The torii has been the guardian of the sea traffic since the distant past. It is said that a god descended on the sea shore in 856. Enjoy the magnificent sight of the "Kamiiso-no-Torii Gate" standing in the sea!



**6 Ushiku Daibutsu Buddha**

84km/60 minutes (by expressway)

The 120-meter tall statue is recorded in the Guinness Book as the tallest bronze statue in the world.



**3 Fukuroda Falls** 56km/80 minutes

With a height of 120m and a width of 73m, Fukuroda Falls is one of the three great falls in Japan. The flow and the sound of the falls are impressive. You can see the beautiful falls change with every season.



**4 Ryujin Big Suspension Bridge**

39km/60 minutes

It is one of the longest pedestrian suspension bridges in Japan. With a height of 100m and a length of 375m, you can enjoy a great panoramic view from the bridge.

## Amazing Sceneries



**1 Hitachi Seaside Park**

6km/10 minutes

A "Floral Paradise" that transforms with every season, expanding throughout the vast area. Enjoy the nemophilas that cover the hill in a sea of blue in the spring and the fluffy bright red kochias in autumn.



**5 Mt. Tsukuba**

7km/85 minutes (by expressway)

Mt. Tsukuba is one of the 100 most celebrated mountains in Japan. From the ropeway and the cable car, you can enjoy a magnificent view of the great nature.

It is famous as a matchmaking power spot because of the two peaks called Nyotai-san (a female mountain) and Nantai-san (a male mountain).



**7 Suigo Itako Iris Garden**

49km/70 minutes

You can enjoy the colors of 500 varieties of irises, about one million flowers blooming at once in the early summer. The Suigoitako Ayame Festival is held from late May to June.
